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Ethical Code of the NGO "International Alliance for HR Readiness" (IAHRR)

Goal:

The ethical code of the NGO "International Alliance for HR Readiness" (IAHRR) establishes high standards of conduct that reflect our mission—to prevent and minimize the loss of human capital through proactive preparation for crises and military challenges.

The code ensures transparency, inclusivity, innovation, accountability, and societal benefit, thereby strengthening the trust of our partners, donors, clients, and the public.

He serves as the foundation for developing an effective interaction system that unites the pursuit of sustainability and security.

Fundamental Principles

- 1. Transparency: Openness in all aspects of operations, from finances to partnerships.
- 2. Inclusivity: Equal opportunities for all, regardless of gender, age, or status.
- 3. Innovation: The implementation of advanced solutions for the development of human resources.
- 4. Responsibility: Fulfillment of obligations to society and partners.
- 5. Public benefit: Reduction of psychogenic, economic, and sanitary losses.
- 6. **Collaboration**: The unification of efforts with governmental, non-governmental, and international institutions.

Code of Ethics

1. Transparency and Accountability

- We publish quarterly reports on activities, financial expenditures, and achievements on the official IAHRR website, ensuring open access for all stakeholders.
- Grant funds and commercial revenues are utilized solely for their intended purposes, with an obligatory annual independent audit.
- Decisions regarding programs and partnerships are made collectively through the supervisory and coordinating councils, ensuring impartiality.
- Partners have access to the current IAHRR database and program evaluation results based on clear performance indicators.

2. Inclusivity and non-discrimination

- All programs are available to civilians, military personnel, and veterans, regardless of gender, ethnicity, or physical characteristics, with an emphasis on equality and fairness.
- We strive for gender balance by ensuring that women comprise at least 40% of participants in our programs and staff.
- Materials and training are adapted for individuals with disabilities, including online formats and accessible resources.
- Any form of discrimination or bias is strictly prohibited in activities, hiring, or collaboration.

3. Responsibility to the public

- Our activities are focused on reducing psychosocial, sanitary, and economic losses while supporting the resilience of human capital.
- We consistently collaborate with governmental institutions to ensure that our initiatives align with national priorities and societal needs.

- In the event of deficiencies, we acknowledge them, inform our partners, and promptly rectify the situation.
- The confidentiality of participants' data in the programs is safeguarded in accordance with international and Ukrainian data protection standards.

4. Innovation and professionalism

- We apply advanced Ukrainian and international expertise along with cutting-edge methodologies, developing programs based on scientific research and the standards of NATO, the EU, and FEMA.
- All initiatives are developed by certified experts, and their effectiveness is assessed using a KPI system, where 80% of participants confirm an increase in readiness.
- The IAHRR staff regularly enhances their qualifications through training and the exchange of experiences with global partners.
- Our methodologies, platforms, and training programs adhere to high-quality standards, delivering practical value.

5. Social benefit and sustainability

- The IAHRR programs contribute to the achievement of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, particularly in education, gender equality, and environmental protection.
- We support psychosocial rehabilitation, professional adaptation of veterans, and the training of civilians, thereby promoting social stability.
- Environmental responsibility is integral to our operations: we utilize digital formats, energy-efficient solutions, and eco-friendly transportation.
- Through the podcast "Time of Readiness" and information campaigns, we strengthen civic awareness and cultural identity.

6. Collaboration and mutually beneficial partnership

- We unite governmental, non-governmental, and international institutions for the collaborative implementation of programs, creating a synergy of efforts.
- Partners gain access to our unique methodologies, reputational bonuses, and the opportunity to tailor resources to their specific needs.
- Collaboration is based on transparent memoranda with clearly defined objectives, roles, and success metrics.
- The intellectual property of the partners and IAHRR is safeguarded through confidentiality agreements.

7. Management of Conflicts of Interest

- All employees and partners report any potential financial, personal, or professional conflicts of interest prior to collaboration.
- We avoid partnerships with organizations that violate ethical standards, particularly those related to corruption or discrimination.
- Contracts with suppliers and partners are established through open tenders, ensuring fairness and transparency.

8. Ethical behavior in business

- We act proactively, anticipating challenges and responding to societal needs with utmost efficiency.
- All events—from conferences to training sessions—are conducted with respect for participants, ensuring their safety and comfort.
- We avoid political bias by focusing on humanitarian and social objectives that bolster community resilience.

Implementation

1.Signature:

• All employees, board members and partners sign the code before starting work.

2.Training:

• Annual ethics training for staff and partners is conducted to strengthen the culture of responsibility. **3.Monitoring:**

- An ethics committee ensures compliance with the code and reviews complaints.
- An anonymous feedback channel is available to program participants via the IAHRR website.

4.Publicity:

- The code is published on the IAHRR website in Ukrainian and English, open to all interested parties.
- An annual report on ethical activities is included in the organization's general report.

5.Sanctions:

• Breaches of the code, such as discrimination or non-transparency,

This ethical code is mandatory for all individuals involved in the activities of IAHRR. We strive to exemplify responsibility, innovation, and care for human capital, thereby creating a reliable future for Ukraine and the world.

To implement the strategic development plan of the NGO "International Alliance for HR Readiness" (IAHRR) for the years 2025–2028, as previously outlined, it is essential to secure funding that integrates grant sources, commercial revenues, and alternative resources.
